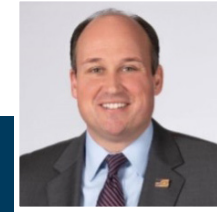

Lack of investment in our infrastructure has plagued our region for decades. While the bipartisan infrastructure bill will help, it will not be a panacea. With it will come good paying jobs, funded training programs, high-speed broad-band, and much improved roads, bridges, and water systems. Each project will stimulate our economy, but more investment is needed. Automation, robotics, globalization, and off-shoring of jobs has caused great displacement of our workers. We need to invest in training to enhance our ability to compete in cutting edge technologies and draw high-tech industries to our area.

Fund an immigration process that: does not take years to complete; makes sure every worker is vetted, has a status, pays taxes/social security; tracks who and where they are; and establishes a route to apply for citizenship. Establish an immigrant worker status that provides long-term year-round farm worker status for the dairy industry similar to the seasonal worker status H-2A: Temporary Agricultural Employment of Foreign Workers. Establish an immigration program to evaluate highly educated and skilled workers who complete their post-grad educations in the US and would like to stay and establish residence in the US with a path to citizenship in areas of our economy where we have unmet needs for their expertise, rather than sending them back to their home countries to become competitors.

I favor funding an additional 2 years of technical, educational or vocational training ≤ cost of 2 years of public community college.

Take a more strategic view of strategic materials and resources. Encourage the President to use the Defense Production Act to provide sufficient computer chips for our electronic products and automobiles, long term. Establish and maintain energy independence so we are not held hostage by the likes of Saudi Arabia and Venezuela. Make sure Oil Companies are doing what they can to increase production and prevent them from price-gouging at the pumps. While monetary policy is not directly in the purview of Congress, the Federal Reserve's ability to increase the discount rate can reduce the rate of inflation but done to excess it could also send the economy into recession.

I want to help businesses to succeed. I would support programs where employers could collaborate with educators to establish work study/training programs that would provide employers high-quality workers with the up-to-date skills needed to help their businesses to succeed and grow. The businesses in turn would provide workers increased economic opportunity. I support local businesses e.g., work to stop big box stores from getting huge concessions to move into communities with promises of extended tax holidays while existing local businesses are left to pick up the tab and putting them at an economic disadvantage.
